Interim Senior Pastor's Column

Somos Unos en Cristo

I find myself humming this beloved hymn that a friend of mine wrote - Somos Uno en Cristo (We Are All One in Christ) much of this week. The lyrics are powerful for me.:

We are all one in Christ, we are one body,

all one people out of many.

We are all one in Christ, we are one body.

all one people out of many.

There is one God, and only one Lord:

there is one faith, one holy love.

There is one baptism, there is one Spirit

who is God the comforter.

With all the turmoil in the world, maybe this song needs to be one that we sing often. ...and live out. We must remember that we are in this together and work for the healing of the church and the world.

I'm convinced that if only we are willing to open ourselves to experience true oneness; the world, the nations, the church, even our congregation would be in much better shape. Being open to living in the oneness of Christ means we reject being defined by our differences and focus on the grace and love of God that unites us. It is only when we are willing to do that that we can move forward and be the people God wants us to be.

The problem is we have become accustomed to being divided, fragmented - and living out of an "us against them" mentality. That mentality does not build community and contribute to health in the society or in the church. But more importantly, it is not the Spirit of the living God. We are called to build up community, to look toward helping each other and those around us. God created us uniquely so we don't all like the exact same things but that need not divide us.

I want you to consider the places that St. Paul needs to come together as one so we can move forward together. We have two distinct worship experiences - both equally valid and Spirit filled. There is not right way to do worship in the Lutheran church. We vary in political allegiances. As long as our first allegiance is to God Almighty, the rest doesn't matter because we say we find our identity in belonging to God in our baptism. All of us are not the same generation. That's just fine because if we were there would be no future and no history.

In other word, church, we need the various gifts that we bring. Indeed I believe we are one in Christ for we are one body; one people out of many. Let us live as the identify as we move into our new program year. freed and forgiven people of God. Let that be our uniting

How We **Understand Faith**

A living, daring confidence in God's grace

When Lutherans talk about faith, we are talking about the relationship God's Holy Spirit creates with us. It's a relationship where God's promise of steadfast love and mercy in Jesus opens us to a life of bold trust in God and joyful, generous service to everyone we know and meet in daily life

Martin Luther was exuberant when he described the freedom of "a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that believers would stake their lives on it a thousand times." He once wrote, "Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. It is impossible for it not to be doing good things unceasingly.

Faith convictions expressed as statements of belief flow from this confident trust in God. ELCA Lutherans share in the faith expressed in the Apostles', Nicene and Athanasian Creeds, in the Lutheran confessional writings (collected as the Book of Concord), and in the ELCA Confession of Faith.

At the same time faith does not close our minds to the world and our hearts to others. We continue to listen to the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments. We listen to the witness of others and we watch for the ways God is active in the world around us. Faith opens a place for engaging others in conversation, for seeking the truth, for asking questions and speaking love in word and deed.

Dear Family & Friends of St. Paul

On Sunday August 13th, we held a special congregational meeting to select a solution to add a grease trap/interceptor to the kitchen. The City of Beloit had informed us of our violation and had given us a due date August 30th to obtain a contractor and start the project. At the meeting, the congregation selected a quote from Max Rykowski for \$5820.00. On August 18th, a contract was signed and a down payment made to begin the project. Actual work will begin once the City and State approve the plans.

At the meeting, many of the congregation, expressed interest in doing more than just a grease trap. Our kitchen does not meet the requirements of the Rock County Health Dept. If we had continued with the Rainbow Station Nursery School, we would have had to remodel the kitchen to meet the Health Dept requirements. We currently have no requirements to meet, but because of our Soup Lunch program, we may have future needs. With this in mind we are forming a "Kitchen Remodel Phase II Committee" to investigate, design and plan for the next step in the use of the kitchen at St Paul. Volunteers are being sought. A signup sheet will be available at the next few services. One can also contact me if they are interested.
