



²³"Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, ²⁴ leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift."

Matthew 5:23-24

Thoughts on the Passing of the Peace.

We begin worship by sharing a greeting that expresses something central to faith – God's peace has come to dwell with us. In this season we are pointed to God's coming in peace to redeem us in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

This month I want to focus on the Passing of the Peace, a highlight of our worship service. It is a time that has been disputed in the Lutheran Church for some time. I remember when it was seen as a stiff turn to two people, solemnly shake their hand and return to facing forward. Now in most churches it is a more free expression of fellowship. "Peace be with you. And, also with you." Has become a formula phrase in some worship settings but it is more than that.

Yes, the Sharing of the Peace is a ritual of friendship and community but it is more than that if we take Jesus' admonition in Matthew 5:23-24 seriously. It is time for reconciliation as we approach receiving the gift of God's forgiveness and reconciliation with us. That said, it is certainly not intermission during the worship service for our small talk. I'm aware that for some this is the highlight of the worship and for others it is viewed as a disruption in the reverence of worship.

All of that begs the question of where to place this rite in the worship service. Theologically and practically this leads me to look at three places during worship that seem appropriate placement.

At the Gathering: Remembering that in both Jewish and Christian history "Shalom" or "Peace" has been a gathering greeting of the faith community. It was a way of saying "Hi. How are you?" as the community gathered for worship. When we say the Kyrie, the first three statements have us praying to the Lord for peace: as we approach God, peace from above, and peace for the whole world. Angels appearing to shocked humans assuring them of peace and no need to be fearful. Jesus even used the same greeting to the startled disciples in the upper room after his resurrection.

In the Middle: The Evangelical Lutheran Worship book places it after the Prayers of the Church as a reminder of Jesus' admonition in Matthew 5:23-24 above. Before we come to the altar of our Lord to be fed, we make peace, are reconciled with our brothers and sisters in Christ. It is both an

act of reconciliation and a welcome to the fellowship of the altar.

At the End: In some of our churches this placement serves to send everyone out with a sense that they are blessed to be a blessing to the world.

Next time you share the peace with another, remember you are blessing another as you have been blessed by God. Shalom my friends,
